This building functioned as a movie theater and gathering place since its inception. But throughout the years, the building fell into disrepair, the theater closed and in 2007 faced demolition. The Heritage Foundation rallied the community and raised funds to acquire, renovate and reopen the theatre to red carpet fanfare in 2011.

Now a state-of-the-art, intimate, 300-seat venue, The Franklin Theatre hosts live concerts, performing arts, cinema, community events and serves as an iconic jewel on Franklin's Main Street.
